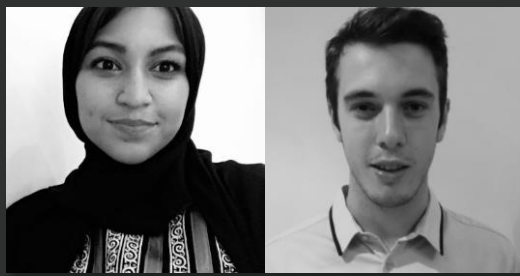

The Life-changing Impact of a Two-day Programme

Every year, the joint YIPA/WCPDF Job Shadow Programme continues to see evolvment and improvement, and this September 2019 programme was no different.

This time around, 14 companies gave 29 grade-11 learners the opportunity to discover what the property industry has to offer.

The chosen learners were selected out of more than 50 applicants from the UCT 100-UP Project, to be a part of this experience. The growth in interested learners has demonstrated the growing interest of youth in the industry - one of the ultimate objectives of the YIPA and the WCPDF partnership.

This year, the programme managed to capture the interest of many new companies and retained many loyal supporters who have participated in the past - a true testament to the social impact the programme has on the hosting companies as well.

The grade 11 learners, from 10 different Khayelitsha schools, found themselves more curious and intrigued by the property industry than they originally thought they would be. Smiling learners and mentors were a true reflection of their fulfilling experiences on the two-day programme.

Learners expressed their excitement about the various engagements they encountered. They also shared their exhilaration about having never before having thought of a career in the property industry, to the enthusiasm of wanting to be a part of the industry as soon as possible.

We see this growth as a major achievement, but an even greater driver to improving the format of the programme towards the best it can be. The programme has the potential to have an even greater social impact on the industry, as well as the many learners who take part in it. We hope the future of this project continues to see potential university candidates emerging from it (we have a number already) and results in both job opportunities and transformation of our sector.

A massive thank you to all the host companies who gave the best of their time to the learners involved, to the WCPDF for the tremendous effort and dedication to this programme, and the UCT 100UP project team for their involvement.

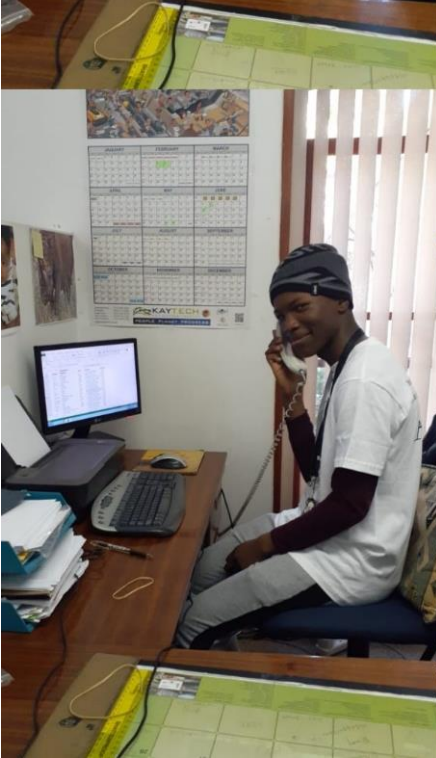
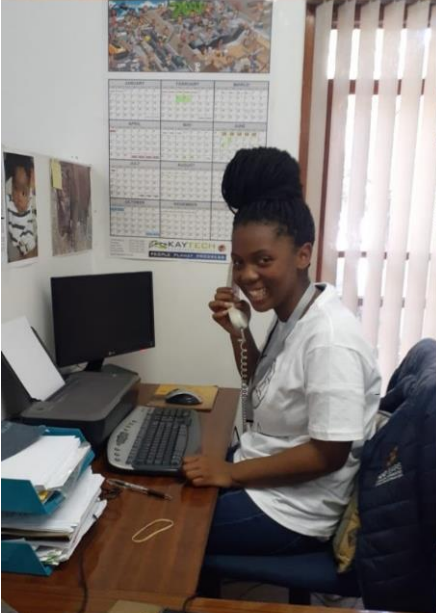
